- * Have had the opportunity to share ideas with other teachers as well as ask questions
- * Have a list of resources where they can find more ideas and suggestions for background reading on the topic

In the mornings, all participants will be together exploring topics with both primary and secondary learners in mind. In the afternoons, participants will choose to attend either a session focused on A: Primary/Lower Secondary or B: Upper Secondary/Adult students.
